North Newton Community Primary School Accessibility Plan 2022-25



The Governors and staff at North Newton Community Primary School wish for and strive to ensure our learners are challenged to be and achieve their very best. To ensure we support all to be able to do so we take account of pupils' varied life experiences and needs. We offer an enriching, broad and balanced curriculum and have high expectaons for all children. The progress, achievements, atudes and well-being of all our children mater.

We are committed to providing an environment that enables full curriculum access that values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their educaon, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emoonal and cultural needs. We are committed to taking posive acon in the spirit of the Equality Act 2010 with regard to disability and to developing a culture of inclusion, support and awareness within the school.

We believe that this Accessibility Plan is compliant with current legislaon and requirements as specified in Schedule 10, relang to Disability, of the Equality Act 2010. School Governors are accountable for ensuring the implementation, review and reporting on progress of the Accessibility Plan over a prescribed period.

The North Newton Community Primary School Accessibility Plan will be reported upon annually in respect of progress and outcomes, and provide a

projected plan for the three year period ahead of the next review date. This plan was updated to reflect new statutory requirements for the seng of Equality Objecves. The Accessibility Plan is structured to complement and support the school's Equality Objecves and will similarly be published on the school website.

Our Accessibility Plan shows how access is to be improved for disabled pupils, staff and visitors to the school in a given meframe and ancipang the need to make reasonable adjustments to accommodate their needs where praccable. The Accessibility Plan relates to the key aspects of physical environment, curriculum and writen informaon.

The Accessibility Plan will contain relevant and mely acons to:

• increase access to **the curriculum** for pupils with a disability, expanding the curriculum as necessary to ensure that pupils with a disability are as, equally prepared for life as are the able-bodied pupils; this covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school such as parcipaon in aerschool clubs, leisure and cultural acvies or school visits - it also covers the provision of specialist or auxiliary aids and equipment, which may assist these pupils in accessing the curriculum within a reasonable meframe;

- improve access to **the physical environment** of the school, adding specialist facilies as necessary this covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access educaon within a reasonable meframe.
- improve the delivery of **writen informaon** to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilies; examples might include handouts, metables, textbooks and informaon about the school and school events; the informaon should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable meframe.

Whole school training will recognise the need to connue raising awareness for staff and governors on equality issues with reference to the Equality Act 2010. The Accessibility Plan for physical accessibility relates to the Access Audit of the School, which was originally undertaken by the Local Authority and subsequently updated by the school and remains the responsibility of the governing body. It may not be feasible to undertake all of the works during the life of this Accessibility Plan and therefore some items will roll forward into subsequent plans. An accessibility audit will be completed by the school prior to the end of each period covering this plan in order to inform the development of a new Accessibility Plan for the ongoing period. Equality Impact Assessments will be undertaken as and when school policies are reviewed. The terms of reference for all governors' committees will include the need to consider Equality and Diversity issues as required by the Equality Act 2010.
