Welcome from the Head,

What a wonderfully busy week it has been here at school!

During my learning walks around the classrooms this week, I have been filled with pride at the sight of our children so fully engaged in their learning. The focused, enthusiastic buzz in each class has been a joy to witness – it truly reflects the hard work and dedication of both our staff and pupils.

Classroom Highlights: Hedgehogs Class have been investigating how to sort objects into different groups. I was particularly impressed with how clearly the children were able to articulate their reasons for sorting, showing great understanding and communication. They have also been practising using their learning talk partners to solve sorting challenges together – fantastic teamwork, Hedgehogs!

Foxes Class have been diving into their history topic by asking, "What makes someone a History Maker?" This has sparked some deep and thoughtful discussions. In addition, they've been tackling our 'Wordy of the Week' challenge: "Is it possible for 2+2 to be anything other than 4?" and demonstrated some excellent critical thinking. Well done, Foxes!

Squirrels Class have been exploring the question: "What stories do ancient treasures tell us about the people of the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages?" Their curiosity and insight into historical artefacts has been very impressive. They've also been stretching their maths brains by working through some complex problem-solving tasks. Well done Squirrels!

Badgers Class have been focusing on the important and thought-provoking question: "How has the history of African civilisations, slavery, and resistance shaped the world we live in today?" I was especially proud of their beautifully presented double-page spreads — both informative and powerful. Some very creative learning, well done Badgers!

Next week, some of our talented Year 5 and 6 pupils will be representing our school in a football tournament at Bridgwater College on **Thursday 9th October**. We wish them the very best of luck, we know they'll do us proud!

A reminder that our **Harvest Festival** will take place on **Tuesday 7th October** at **9.30pm** in the Church. We are delighted that Pre-School will also be joining us for this special service. We warmly invite all parents and carers to attend and celebrate this season of thankfulness with us.

Dark grey or black trousers or shorts


Black/grey pinafore skirt

Sept 2025-July 2026


Breakfast club is open Monday — Friday 7.30-8.45am in the Village
